



WILMINGTON CITY COUNCIL

Wilmington's City Council includes **six council members and the mayor**, all elected at-large every two years in **nonpartisan** elections.

Council members shape local policy and are responsible for:

- How We Grow: Land Planning, Zoning Decisions, Development
- Safety: Streets, Police, Fire
- Environment: Water Quality, Trash Collection, Tree Canopy, Green Spaces

It's a big commitment — council members spend hours each week in meetings, briefings, work sessions, and on various committees, making key decisions that impact our daily lives.

WHO CONTROLS OUR ROADS AND INTERSECTIONS?

Most major roads and intersections in Wilmington are planned and funded by the **North Carolina Department of Transportation** (**NCDOT**). Smaller streets and neighborhood roads are typically maintained and financed by the city.

NCDOT

NCDOT works closely with the Wilmington Urban Area Metropolitan Planning Organization (WMPO) to coordinate regional road improvements, manage access for new developments to NCDOT-controlled roads, and oversee related expenditures.

WMPO

WMPO is a federally mandated and funded regional transportation planning agency. Its board includes elected officials from Wilmington and surrounding counties, as well as a representative from NCDOT.

Before new developments receive approval, WMPO reviews proposed plans to evaluate their potential impacts on local roads and intersections. The agency determines whether proposed access points to public streets are acceptable and may recommend or require specific traffic improvements to be completed by the developer as a condition of final project approval.



Celebrate Success

EDEN VILLAGE

Eden Village of Wilmington is a 31-unit, pedestrian-only tiny home community that provides permanent, **affordable housing** for disabled and chronically homeless individuals. Located next to the airport and adjacent to the Salvation Army Complex, residents have access to transportation, job training, and support services.



Each resident pays \$300 per month and must have a source of income, with most receiving about \$1,000 per month from government assistance.

2,000+ VOTERS MUST UPDATE REGISTRATION

With the November 4th election approaching, now is the time to start learning about local issues and candidates. The more informed you are, the more confident you'll feel when it's time to cast your vote.





More than 2,000 New Hanover County residents must update their voter registration to remain eligible for the upcoming municipal election. If your registration is missing key information—such as your driver's license number or the last four digits of your Social Security number—you'll need to update it to avoid potential issues at the polls.
